Wildlife resources helping law enforcement

What does the program do?

The Wildlife Assets Program enables the public to legally purchase items such as antlers, head mounts, hides and other wildlife parts that have been seized during law enforcement investigations, obtained from animals killed in vehicle collisions, or acquired through donations. The funds raised through these sales are used to support the Arizona Game and Fish Department's law enforcement program.

What is the money used for?

The money goes toward the purchase of equipment (evidence collection kits, digital cameras, audio




recorders, metal detectors, night vision equipment, decoys) and specialized training (interview and interrogation classes, wildlife forensics classes, crime scene investigation training) that assist officers in more effectively performing their duties.

Where can I purchase wildlife assets?

The primary venue where these assets are sold is the International Sportsmen's Exposition (ISE), held each spring at the University of Phoenix Stadium in Glendale, Ariz. The Department typically sells, through a silent auction process, dozens of sets of elk and deer antlers, and several mounts and hides at ISE each year. Some of these assets are of trophy





quality, some are very unique, and some include a variety of artwork.

Select assets are sold during a number of fundraising banquets held by sportsmen's/conservation organizations. The money raised by these sales is returned to the Department's law enforcement program. As one example of the contributions these groups make, a 245-inch mule deer

rack that was seized from an illegal hunter on the famed Arizona strip recently sold for \$22,000 at one of the banquets.

How can I donate wildlife assets?

If you have horns, hides, wildlife mounts or artwork you no longer want, please consider donating them to the Wildlife Assets Program. Your donation will help protect Arizona's valuable wildlife resources by supporting law enforcement activities to deter and punish poachers and other violators of Arizona wildlife laws.

Call Operation Game Thief to report wildlife law violations

Many of the wildlife assets that come into the Department's possession are obtained from tips through the Operation Game Thief hotline. If you witness poaching or other violations of wildlife laws, please call the toll-free hotline at (800) 352-0700, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Callers may be eligible for a reward ranging from \$50-\$1,000 for information leading to the arrest of wildlife law violators. Calls may remain confidential upon request.
