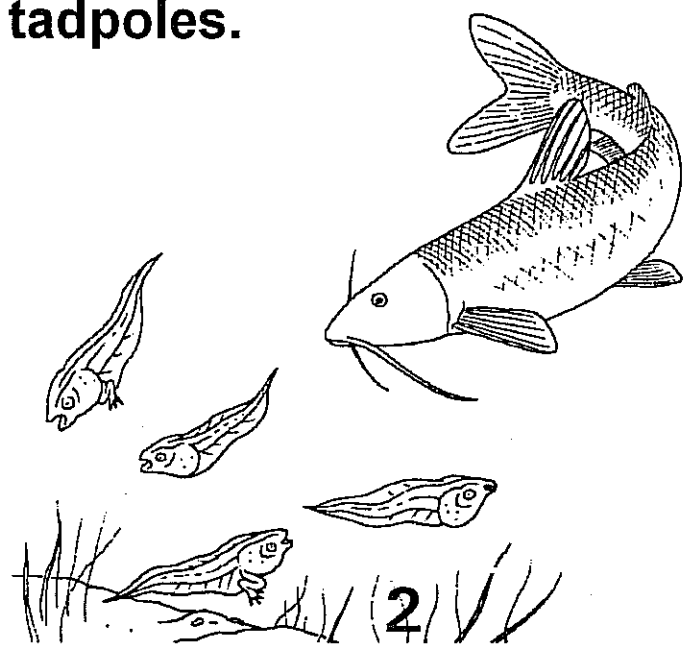
# Toad

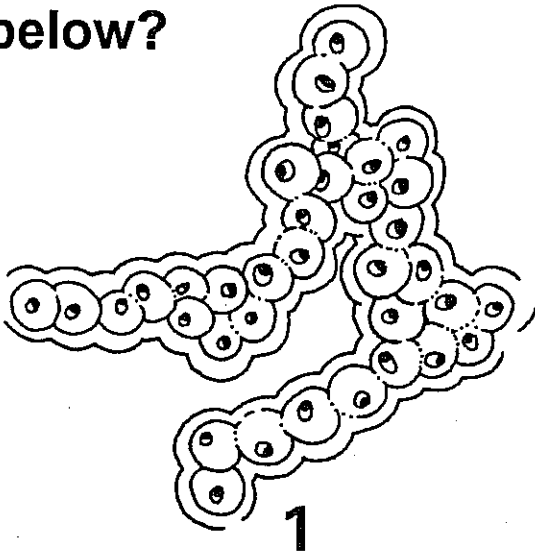
Tadpoles hatch from the eggs. Many animals eat tadpoles.



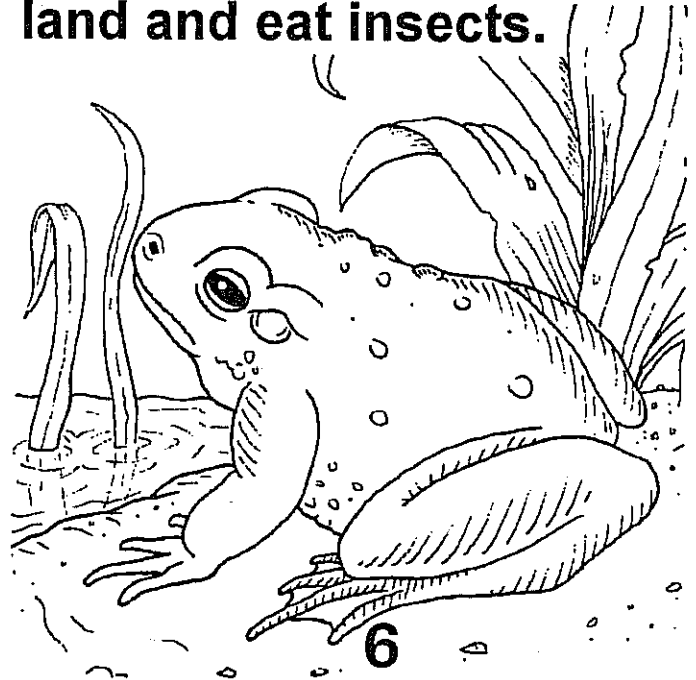

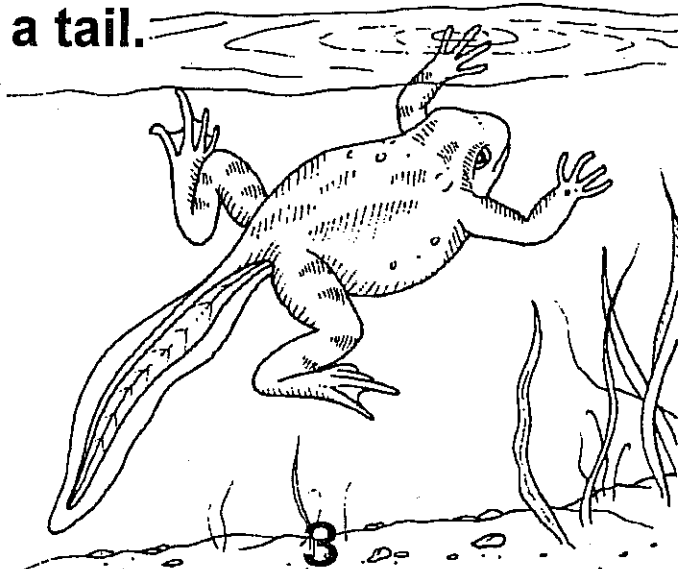
Toads lay many eggs in water. How many eggs can you count in the mass below?
