Birds of Prey


Hawks, eagles, and owls are called birds of prey.

They hunt for their food.


The animals they eat are called prey.

Mice, rats, snakes, fish, birds, and insects are prey.




Birds of prey use their good eyesight and hearing to find their food.

They use their sharp, hooked beak to tear their food.




Birds of prey use their sharp claws, called talons, to catch their prey.


Birds of Prey Coloring Page




The kestrel has a white face and chest. Its body and tail are reddish brown. Its legs are yellow.
