Pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.02, notice is hereby given to the general public that a quorum of the Arizona Game and Fish Commission may attend and participate in the Arizona Game and Fish Department Conservationist Committee Workday Project, (Slate Lakes Grasslands Restoration) being held in Game Management Units 7E and 7W, May 21-23, 2010. The camp location is ¼ southwest of Highway 180 on Forest Service Road 191, which is located at milepost 242.5 on Highway 180, north of Flagstaff, Az. Check-in begins 3:00 P.M. Friday, May 21, 2010. The Commission will take no legal action. The Commission will not discuss or deliberate on any matter reasonably anticipated to come before the Commission for legal action.

Background materials provided to Commission members concerning the workday project are available for public inspection at the main office of the Arizona Game and Fish Department at 5000 W. Carefree Highway, Phoenix Az, 85086, and at Department regional offices in Pinetop, Flagstaff, Kingman, Yuma, Tucson, and Mesa.

Funding is provided from the sale of licenses and permits; watercraft registration fees; federal excise taxes on firearms, fishing equipment, boats, and other sporting goods; State lottery revenues; donations on State income tax forms; and various contracts and grants. Department policy is set by the Arizona Game and Fish Commission, whose five members are appointed by the Governor.
