13. Presenter: Amber Munig, Acting Big Game Supervisor. Request to Approve Proposed Translocation of Merriam's Turkeys to Utah. The Utah Division of Wildlife Resources has requested up to 50 Merriam's turkeys each year for 2 years from Arizona to restore populations that suffered from winter die-offs during 2010. The Commission may go into Executive Session for the purpose of obtaining legal advice from the Commission Attorneys on any of the above agenda items pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.03 (A) (3) & (4).


One or more members of the Commission may appear and participate in the meeting telephonically or by other electronic means.

The Arizona Game and Fish Department is responsible for managing Arizona's fish and wildlife resource as an enduring public trust. In addition, the Department is charged with promoting safe and responsible use of watercraft and off-highway vehicles. Funding is

provided from the sale of licenses and permits; watercraft registration fees; federal excise taxes on firearms, fishing equipment, boats, and other sporting goods; State lottery revenues; donations on State income tax forms; and various contracts and grants. Department policy is set by the Arizona Game and Fish Commission, whose five members are appointed by the Governor.
