Thursday, August 26, 2010, 10:00 a.m. at the Northern Arizona Shooting Range/Foster Ranch Property.

Pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.02, notice is hereby given to the general public that a quorum of the Arizona Game and Fish Commission may attend and participate in a sound study at the Foster Ranch property, located east of Flagstaff, AZ. Directions to the site are as follows:

From Flagstaff, travel East on I-40 to the Winona exit, (exit 211). Travel south on the Winona Ranch Road approximately 2.3 miles to its junction with Forest Service Road (FSR) 128H. Travel West on FSR 128H approximately 3.8 miles to its junction with FSR 128A. Travel southeast on FSR 128A approximately .34 miles to the property.

The purpose of the field trip is to conduct initial sound testing at the future range site. The Commission will take no legal action. The Commission will not discuss or deliberate on any matter reasonably anticipated to come before the Commission for legal action.

Background materials provided to Commission members concerning the tour are available for public inspection at the main office of the Arizona Game and Fish Department at 5000 W. Carefree Highway, Phoenix AZ, 85086, and at Department regional offices in Pinetop, Flagstaff, Kingman, Yuma, Tucson, and Mesa.

Persons with a disability may request a reasonable accommodation, such as a sign language interpreter, or this document in an alternative format, by contacting the AGFD Deputy Director, 5000 W. The Arizona Game and Fish Department is responsible for managing Arizona's fish and wildlife resource as an enduring public trust. In addition, the Department is charged with promoting safe and responsible use of watercraft and off-highway vehicles. Funding is provided from the sale of licenses and permits; watercraft registration fees; federal excise taxes on firearms, fishing equipment, boats, and other sporting goods; State lottery revenues; donations on State income tax forms; and various contracts and grants. Department policy is set by the Arizona Game and Fish Commission, whose five members are appointed by the Governor.
