Wildlife Managers are Arizona State certified peace officers that work flexible hours, utilize a 'take home' vehicle and have a home office. They perform a variety of activities that include:

- Enforcing wildlife, off-highway vehicle and watercraft laws;
- Conducting wildlife and fish surveys;
- Evaluating and improving wildlife habitats;
- Conducting hunter and boater education classes, and informative presentations.

LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must be at least 21 years-old and a citizen of the United States.



MINIMUM EDUCATION REQUIRED

Applicants must have a Bachelor's degree in wildlife science or a closely related field from an accredited college or university.

STARTING SALARIES

Beginning salary is based on years of experience and education.

II- Grade 19.....	\$36,277- \$56,964
III- Grade 20.....	\$42,493- \$62,692

Salaries may be adjusted annually based on agency performance.
