22 Last day for House consideration of House bills and Senate consideration of Senate bills.

## Legislative News:

### Upcoming Committee Meetings of Interest:

Monday, February 16<sup>th</sup> Senate Rules 1pm, Caucus Room 1

#### **SB1185: appropriation; wolf recovery; litigation costs**

Appropriates \$250,000 from the general fund in FY2015-16 to the Department of law for litigation expenses relating to a challenge against any expansion of the Mexican wolf recovery program in Arizona. On February 6<sup>th</sup>, the Commission voted to support this legislation contingent on appropriate language change to reflect consistency with the Commission supported, Final Revision to the Regulations for the Nonessential Experimental Population of the Mexican Wolf issued by the USFWS on January 12, 2015. This bill passed the Senate Natural Resources Committee on Monday, February 9<sup>th</sup>.

Monday, February 16<sup>th</sup> Senate Natural Resources 9am, SHR109

#### **SB1386: wildlife transportation and release prohibition**

It is unlawful for a "person" (defined as an individual, partnership, corporation, group, company, society, the federal government, state or local government or any political subdivision) to knowingly and without lawful authority import and transport into Arizona and release within Arizona a species of wildlife that is listed as a threatened, endangered or candidate species under the federal Endangered Species Act. Violations are a class 4 (mid-level) felony, except that violations with the intent to disrupt or interfere with the development or use of public natural resources to establish the presence of the species in an area not currently known to be occupied by that species is a class 2 (second-highest) felony. It is unlawful for a person to release wildlife except as expressly permitted by state statute.

Thursday, February 19<sup>th</sup> 9am-HHR 5

#### **SB1387: recreational user immunity; access**

For the purpose of a property owner or occupant being immune from liability except in cases of negligence for injury to a "recreational user" of the property (defined as a person to whom permission has been granted or implied without the payment of an admission fee to travel across or enter for various recreational pursuits), payment by a state agency to an owner or lessee for public recreational access to the premises is not considered payment of an admission fee.

Tuesday, February 17<sup>th</sup> Senate Appropriations – SHR 109 2pm

**[SB1466: Livestock loss board; compensation fund](#)**

Establishes a 9-member Livestock Loss Board to address the depredation of wolves on livestock operations. The Board is required to establish and implement procedures to compensate landowners, lessees or livestock operators for livestock depredation caused by wolves. The Livestock Compensation Fund is established for this purpose. The Board is required to submit a report to the Governor and the Legislature by December 31 of each year that includes specified information on the compensation and any recommendations. The Board terminates on July 1, 2023. On February 6<sup>th</sup>, the Commission voted to support this bill contingent on amendment language that would protect and clarify eligible compensation funds as funds appropriated from the state general funds and not Arizona Game and Fish Department funds. This bill was amended with [amendment #4111](#) to change the language of the bill but did not substantially change the purpose of the bill. On February 10<sup>th</sup> this bill, as amended, passed the Senate Rural Affairs and Environment Committee 3-1 and will be heard in the Senate Appropriations Committee on February 17<sup>th</sup>.

**Commission Supported Legislation:**

**[HB2236: ATV and motorcycle passengers](#)**

A person other than the operator is prohibited from riding on a motorcycle or all-terrain vehicle unless the motorcycle or ATV is equipped, instead of designed, to carry more than one person. On February 6<sup>th</sup>, the Commission voted to support this bill. On February 10<sup>th</sup> this bill passed the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee 8-1.

**[HB2396: wildlife; guides; firearms](#)**

Would allow hunting guides, while on a hunt, to carry firearms other than a revolver or pistol. Would strike A.R.S. § 17-362(D) No person acting as guide shall carry firearms other than a revolver or pistol. On February 12<sup>th</sup> this bill passed the House 57-1 and was transmitted to the Senate.

**[HB2399: G&F; hunter harassment](#)**

Would add A.R.S § 17-316 (Interference with rights of hunters; classification; civil action; exceptions) to the list of revocable offences under A.R.S 17-340 Revocation, suspension and denial of right to obtain license; notice; violation; classification. It would allow the Commission to revoke a person's license that has violated hunter harassment statutes. On February 12<sup>th</sup> this bill passed the House 58-0 and was transmitted to the Senate.

Thursday, February 19<sup>th</sup>, 9am-HHR 5

**[HB2365: off-highway vehicles; enforcement](#)**

Would provide state, county and local peace officers the flexibility of enforcing Title 28 laws on federally managed lands. This bill will be discussed at the House Military Affairs and Public Safety Committee on February 19<sup>th</sup>.
