AGFD Legislation NEWS:

- **HB 2116** and **HB 2117** both dealing with the transfer of tags to minor children passed the House by a vote of 56-0 & 45-11 respectfully. The Commission supports both measures.
- The **joint sub-appropriations committee** on natural resources and education met Monday and adopted 96% of the Commission supported Game and Fish Budget. The recommendation moves to the full joint-appropriation committee.
- **SB 1305** *veterans; disabled; fishing licenses* was heard in the Senate Natural Resources and Rural Affairs Committee Wednesday and passed unanimously. The bill lowers from 100 to 70% the disability a veteran must have to receive a complimentary license.
- **HB 2443** *off-highway vehicles; user fee* will be heard in the House Natural Resources and Public Safety Committee on Wednesday (Feb. 7). *A strike-everything amendment is proposed.*
- **Jennifer L. Martin** has been nominated by the Governor to fill a vacancy on the Commission. Currently she holds a seat left vacant after the Senate failed to confirm her last legislative session.

The minor must be accompanied in the field by the transferring grandparent or the minor's parent or guardian. AS PASSED HOUSE.	First sponsor: Rep. H2117: GAME & FISH; BIG GAME PERMITS; TRANSFERS	The list of people to whom a holder of a big game permit may transfer the permit is expanded to include a minor child with a permanent physical disability (defined). If the child is younger than 14, the child must complete the hunter education course offered by Dept of Game and Fish.	First sponsor: Rep. Jerry Weiers.		1/30 passed House 45-11 ; ready for Senate.
S1305: VETERANS; DISABLED; FISHING LICENSES	The Game and Fish Commission may issue complimentary fishing licenses to veterans who are receiving compensation for permanent service connected disabilities rated at least 70% disabling. S1355: GOLDWATER RANGE; CONCURRENT JURISDICTION	The list of lands for which the federal government may request concurrent criminal jurisdiction with the state is expanded by adding the Barry M. Goldwater Range.	First sponsor: Sen. Aguirre.		2/1 referred to Senate jud .

H2137: GAME & FISH LICENSES; DISABLED VETERANS	The Game and Fish Commission may issue complimentary licenses to veterans who have disabilities rated as less than 100% disabling, but who are rated as individually unemployable (previously, only veterans with disabilities that are 100% disabling were eligible). To qualify for complimentary licenses, disabled veterans must provide a letter from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs stating their disability rating.	First sponsor: Rep. Rios.	1/22 withdrawn from House trans and additionally referred to nat res-pub .
H2227: RESTAURANTS; ILLEGAL FEEDING OF WILDLIFE	Patrons of a licensed restaurant are added to the list of situations that do not constitute illegal feeding of wildlife. Retroactive to September 21, 2006.	First sponsor: Rep. McClure.	1/18 referred to House jud .
H2443: OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLES; USER FEE	Various changes in statutes related to operation of off-highway vehicles, including a requirement that off-highway vehicles display a sticker (indicia is the term of art) issued by the Dept of Transportation and that a fee is charged for the indicia. Proceeds from the sale of indicia shall be used by the state land dept to mitigate the impact of vehicles on its land. Effective July 1, 2008.	First sponsor: Rep. Jerry Weiers.	1/23 referred to House nat res-pub .
S1026: EXTREME DUI; SENTENCE	Language giving a judge the discretion to suspend all but 10 days of a jail sentence for extreme DUI if the defendant completes a court-ordered alcohol or drug treatment program is deleted.	First sponsor: Sen. Waring.	1/25 Senate COW approved with floor amend #3064 ; amend 3018 was withdrawn.
S1029: DUI; EXTREME; 0.20 CONCENTRATION ENHANCEMENT	If a person who is convicted of extreme DUI has a BAC of 0.20 or more (exceeding the extreme DUI threshold of 0.15), sentencing minimums are increased, for example for a first violation the person must serve a minimum of 45 days in jail and pay a \$500 fine (increased from 30 days and \$250); for a second violation within 84 months, the minimums are 180 days in jail and a \$1000 fine (increased from 120 days and \$500). Additionally, for those convicted of extreme DUI with a BAC of less than 0.20, an ignition interlock device is required for 18 months; if the BAC is 0.20 or greater, the device is required for 24 months.	First sponsor: Sen. Waring.	1/29 passed Senate 28-0 ; ready for House.
