H2129: GAME AND FISH; ENFORCEMENT; PENALTIES	Minimum fines for illegal taking of wildlife are increased. Game and Fish may permanently revoke or suspend for a period of five years or more a person's hunting privileges for repeat violations, unlawful taking of trophy (defined) or endangered species or taking three times the established limit. The commission may initiate proceedings to intercept a violator's state tax refund to pay the fine. The maximum balance in the Wildlife Theft Prevention Fund is no longer limited to \$50,000. S1438: UNLAWFUL FEEDING OF WILDLIFE	A person, in a county with a population of 280,000 or more people, is guilty of unlawful feeding of wildlife, a petty offense, by intentionally or recklessly feeding, attracting or otherwise enticing wildlife into an area, with exceptions for public employees performing their lawful duties and normal agricultural or livestock operations. H2127: NONRESIDENT BIG GAME PERMITS; LIMITS	The Game and Fish Commission shall limit the number of big game permits awarded to nonresidents during random drawings to 10% or fewer of the total number awarded except in extraordinary circumstances, at a public meeting the commission may increase the number of permits issued to nonresidents in a random drawing if, on separate roll call votes the members unanimously support the finding of an extraordinary circumstance and adopt the increased number of nonresident permits for the hunt. Up to 400,000 acres of trust land not in an urban area (defined) may be designated by the Legislature as reserved for conservation. In an urban area, trust land may be used for commercial purposes if the plan was developed in consultation with local government. If the development is in conflict with parts of the plan developed by local government, the dispute is to be resolved in a manner prescribed by law. The development plan may include additional trust land to be designated for conservation if by doing so there is sufficient enhancement in the value of the developed land to at least equal the value of the additional land designated for conservation. Trust land within an urban area may be conveyed to a governmental entity for certain easements and public rights-of-way or if it was classified suitable for conservation before Jan 1, 2005. This amendment is conditional on Congress amending the Arizona - New Mexico [Statehood] Enabling Act by Dec 31, 2008.
