AGFD Legislation NEWS:

- Today marks the 89th day of the 2nd Regular Session, 47th Legislature.
- **SB 1291** *shooting ranges; prohibition* has passed Appropriations (P) and is awaiting Rules committee.
- **SB 1441** has a proposed s/e amendment titled: *wildlife habitat restoration; appropriation* passed House appropriations (P) committee 11-2. The bill moves to the House Rules committee.
- **HB 2127** *nonresident big game permits; limits* ~~is awaiting action by the Governor. Action must take place by or on April 8th, Saturday.~~ **Due to an administrative procedure error this bill was not transmitted properly from the House. Once the bill has been correctly transmitted from the House the Governor has 5 days to take action on it.**
- **HB 2130** *game and fish; hunter harassment* has passed the Senate 30-0. Moves back to the House for action on Senate amendments (final read).

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| H2129: GAME AND FISH; ENFORCEMENT; PENALTIES— Striker: illegal hunting; penalties | Minimum fines for illegal taking of wildlife are increased. Game and Fish may permanently revoke or suspend for a period of five years or more a person's hunting privileges for repeat violations, unlawful taking of trophy (defined) or endangered species or taking three times the established limit. The commission may initiate proceedings to intercept a violator's state tax refund to pay the fine. The maximum balance in the Wildlife Theft Prevention Fund is no longer limited to \$50,000. | H2130: GAMES AND FISH; HUNTER HARASSMENT | The list of actions punishable by class 2 misdemeanor for interfering with lawful hunting activity is expanded to include item such as making or attempting to make physical contact with a person lawfully taking wildlife and interjecting oneself into the line of fire. AS PASSED SENATE | First sponsor: Jerry Weiers | 4/4 passed Senate 30-0; ready for House action on Senate amendments. |

| S1438: UNLAWFUL FEEDING OF WILDLIFE | A person, in a county with a population of 280,000 or more people, is guilty of unlawful feeding of wildlife, a petty offense, by intentionally or recklessly feeding, attracting or otherwise enticing wildlife into an area, with exceptions for public employees performing their lawful duties and normal agricultural or livestock operations. 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| H2127: NONRESIDENT BIG GAME PERMITS; LIMITS | The Game and Fish Commission shall limit the number of big game permits awarded to nonresidents during random drawings to 10% or fewer of the total number awarded except in extraordinary circumstances, at a public meeting the commission may increase the number of permits issued to nonresidents in a ransom drawing if, on separate roll call votes the members unanimously support the finding of an extraordinary circumstance and adopt the increased number of nonresident permits for the hunt. 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| HCR2045: STATE TRUST LAND REFORM | The 2006 general election ballot is to carry the question of whether to amend various articles of the state constitution to modify the requirement that state trust land must be sold to the highest bidder at public auction. Up to 400,000 acres of trust land not in an urban area (defined) may be designated by the Legislature as reserved for conservation. In an urban area, trust land may be used for commercial purposes if the plan was developed in consultation with local government. If the development is in conflict with parts of the plan developed by local government, the dispute is to be resolved in a manner prescribed by law. The development plan may include additional trust land to be designated for conservation if by doing so there is sufficient enhancement in the value of the developed land to at least equal the value of the additional land designated for conservation. Trust land within an urban area may be conveyed to a governmental entity for certain easements and public rights-of-way or if it was classified suitable for conservation before Jan 1, 2005. This amendment is conditional on Congress amending the Arizona - New Mexico [Statehood] Enabling Act by Dec 31, 2008.
