AGFD Legislation NEWS:

- Today marks the 152nd day of the 2nd Regular Session, 47th Legislature.
- **Budget:** Budget talks have stalled between the two houses, there doesn't appear to be enough votes to move the budget. No one is talking to the Governor.
- **HB 2577 immigration omnibus** was vetoed by the Governor on June 6th.

The maximum balance in the Wildlife Theft Prevention Fund (where fines for illegal taking of wildlife are deposited) is no longer limited to \$50,000 and minimum fine amount for violations are increased.
