## Welcome to the Arizona Game and Fish Department Outdoor Expo!

Welcome to Arizona's largest hands-on outdoor exposition, where you can actually experience a wide range of interesting products and outdoor activities. You can shoot a variety of firearms from top firearms manufacturers, try your hand at archery, or attend informative workshops. From live wildlife and ATVs to the catch-and-release fish tank and cowboy action and mounted shooting – it's all here.

### How should I plan my day?

There are loads of fun and interesting things to do. Just like at a major amusement park, your biggest challenge is going to be doing it all in one day. The activities are grouped into four areas. You can use the free trolleys or the walking trails to visit each of them. To help you get started, we are providing a map (and activity schedule) on the inside pages. Keep it handy. It is like a treasure map of fun things to do and see at the Expo. Here are just a few of the activities you can choose from:

### AREA 1 – Firearm Manufacturers, Specialty Shooting, Outdoor Vendors, Outdoor Groups, Boating, Food Court

Try out firearms in a safe, supervised environment on the shooting range. Manufacturers on hand will include Sturm, Ruger & Co., GLOCK, and Smith & Wesson.

Interested in learning different specialty shooting disciplines? Try your hand at cowboy action shooting, black powder, tactical pistol, rifle and pistol silhouette, and more, hosted by local shooting organizations. Kids will have the opportunity to shoot .22s and air guns and learn more about firearm safety. There is a nominal charge for ammunition at some of the shooting venues.

Visit with commercial vendors and sportsmen's/outdoor organizations in the Outdoor Vendors Tent and Outdoor Groups Tent. The main Arizona Game and Fish Department information booth is located in the Outdoor Vendors Tent. Learn about boating safety and boating recreation in the boating area. Food and beverages are available for purchase at the Food Court.

### AREA 2 – Off-Highway Vehicles, Horse-Mounted Shooting Competition, Hunting Dog Demonstrations

Learn everything you wanted to know about off-highway vehicle (OHV) recreation! View quads, dirt bikes, rock crawlers, 4x4s and other OHVs. See exciting rock crawler, trial bike and ATV demonstrations. Learn where to ride and what clubs you can join. Learn about the new OHV laws that went into effect Jan. 1. Get tips on how to ride responsibly to protect wildlife habitat.



In this area, you can also see exciting horse-mounted shooting competition from the Arizona Cowboy Mounted Shooters Association. You can also attend educational demonstrations on hunting dogs working in collaboration with their owners.

### AREA 3 – Family Adventure, Archery, Fishing, Outdoor Workshops

Bring your family to the kids' catch-and-release fishing area, view live wildlife displays (including hawks, owls and rattlesnakes), get fishing tips, see casting demos, and do activities at the hunter education field course/nature trail.

Take an archery class or try out 3D archery on a walking course through the desert. See the state's top archers compete at the Arizona Outdoor Archery State Championships. Learn about bowfishing. Visit with archery vendors and exhibitors.

Visit outdoor organizations in the Family Adventure Tent and nearby grounds. Head over to the Fisherman's Choice Casting and Demonstration Tent or the Game and Fish Demonstration Tent for our series of entertaining, interactive workshops. A complete schedule is located on the inside pages.

### AREA 4 – Clay Target Center

Make the short trolley trip out to the completely refurbished Clay Target Center and learn how to shoot skeet and trap in a safe, supervised environment. Learn how to reload shot shells or try your luck at the "Break-A-Clay" game. Visit with vendors and other exhibitors.

On Saturday, you can watch the Scholastic Clay Target Program's Commissioner's Cup Sporting Clays State Championships. More than 150 youths will compete for state titles.






