

## WHAT'S LOCATED IN EACH AREA?

### AREA 1 - FAMILY ADVENTURE

- Cabela's Archery Village:
  - Archery classes – Take a 30-minute archery class. This is a GREAT activity for kids and parents to do together. Must be 8 years of age or older. Classes start at 10 a.m., 11 a.m., 12 noon, 1 p.m., 2 p.m., 3 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday (and 4 p.m. on Saturday only).

  - Demos of bows, targets, more. Camping demos every hour.
  - Demos and tips by Randy Ulmer, renowned competitive archer and elite member of the National Bowhunters Hall of Fame – 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Sunday.
- Live wildlife exhibits.

- Youth .22 rifle target shooting.

## WHAT'S LOCATED IN EACH AREA?

### AREA 2 - MAIN AREA

- Firearm manufacturers – Try out firearms from Glock, Ruger, Smith & Wesson, Remington and Beretta; nominal fee for ammunition.
- Specialty shooting – Try out different types of specialty shooting or view demos (some venues charge nominal fee for ammunition):
  - Steel target shooting (Honeywell Sportsman Club).
  - Mini gun demo (Dillon Aero).
  - Practical pistol shooting (Cactus Match League).
  - Cowboy action shooting (Arizona Cowboy Shooters Association).
- Boat show – Boats on display, exhibits and information on boating recreation and safety.
- Visit outdoor exhibitors and vendors at the Outdoor Exhibitors Tent.
- Visit outdoor and conservation organizations at the Conservation Organizations Tent.
- Large fish/casting Demo Tank.
- Food vendors.
- Restrooms and first aid station.

#### Demos in Area 2:

- **Fast-draw demos** – Cowboy Action Shooting area. Held periodically throughout Saturday and Sunday.
- **Mini gun demo** – Mini Gun area. Held periodically throughout Saturday and Sunday.
- **Casting demos and fishing tips** – Demo Fishing Tank. Held periodically throughout Saturday and Sunday.

### AREA 3 - OHV, MOUNTED SHOOTING ARENA, SHOTGUN

- Off-highway vehicle exhibits and information.
- Exciting cowboy mounted shooting competition (see schedule at right).
- Learn how to shoot shotguns (Arizona Skeet Shooting Association).

- Try out shotguns (Benelli, Remington, Beretta).
- Sporting dog demonstrations.
- Food vendors.
- Restrooms and first aid station.

#### Demos and competition in Area 3:

**Thrilling rock crawler and trial bike demos** – Held at the Rock Crawler area. Demos held at 9:30 a.m., 10:30 a.m., 11:30 a.m., 12:30 p.m., 1:30 p.m., 2:30 p.m., 3:30 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday (and 4:30 p.m. on Saturday only).

**Amazing shotgun shooting demos** – Held at the Shotgun area (Saturday only). Incredible exhibition shooter Travis Mears will do two demonstrations for Beretta at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. (brought to you by Cabela's).

**Sporting dog demos** – Held periodically throughout Saturday and Sunday at the Sporting Dog area.

**Exciting cowboy mounted shooting competition** – Held at the Mounted Shooting Arena at the times indicated below:

Saturday, March 26

9 a.m. – **Eliminator competition** – Fast-paced cowboy mounted shooting where only the top competitors come back for the finals.

1 p.m. – **Rifle mounted shooting competition** – Competitors use a handgun for the first five targets and a rifle for the remaining five.

2 p.m. – **Cavalry mounted shooting competition** – Includes pageantry and history along with mounted shooting.

3 p.m. – **Wild West show** – Finals of above matches, plus trick riding, Pony Express, cavalry, stage coach, hosted by a re-enacted Buffalo Bill.

Sunday, March 27

**Main match cowboy mounted shooting competition** – All day.
