

The Ben Avery Sure Shot Introductory Shooting Program and is primarily designed for the novice shooter ages 16 and up in mind. The program uses .22 caliber revolvers, semi-automatics and bolt action rifles. The program is scheduled on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of every month with no requirement that you attend after that. It is not a shooting club. The Game and Fish Rangemasters have the desire to increase participation in the shooting sports and starting people out right in a stress/worry free environment with a solid foundation of firearms safety, firearms familiarization, the basic shooting fundamentals, and range safety is our goal. We really have a great time out here at the range with all of our participants.

The first time someone attends they need to be at the facility's activity center around 6:15 pm in order to sign in, class will start promptly at 6:30. The classroom portion lasts about an hour and then moves to the range for the personal one on one coaching and live fire exercises. Shooting that first night is usually completed by around 9:00 pm. We have large lights that we turn on, so don't worry about darkness in the winter time. At the conclusion of the classroom portion, individuals are issued a course completion card that they will need to bring with them to the main range. This means your first trip to the facility gets you free ammunition (50 rounds) and free use of the range facility (the range fee of \$7.00 per shooter is waived). You are also allowed to use Game and Fish firearms as long as you participate in the program on those Tuesday nights. It's not a requirement that you own a firearm to participate in this program. You can always use one of ours. On your next trip, you'll need to provide .22 long rifle ammunition if you wish to use Game and Fish firearms and pay the range fee of \$7.00.

On your next visits to the range, you can arrive as early as 6:00 pm and shoot until 9:00. Keep your class completion card and bring it with you, the use of Game and Fish Firearms and personal coaching is still free! Even if you own and wish to bring your own firearm to the range, you can still use one of ours to build on the basic fundamentals of shooting taught previously. Eye and ear protection is required on the range and you will be given a free set of eye protection if you don't own a set on your first trip to the range. Ear protection is also provided for you to use, but we recommend purchasing a set for your own personal comfort.
