I am the owner of five (5) parcels on the west side of I-17 in Munds Park that total approximately 150 acres. To the best of my knowledge, I am the largest private landowner in the Munds Park area. I have just recently been made verbally aware that Game and Fish has selected a Willow Springs site as the preferred location of a shooting range. I did not receive any notice regarding the Willow Springs site. From the maps, that I have just viewed on the game and fish website, it appears that this location is immediately adjacent to my land.

Here is a list of the parcels: 400-44-001B, 400-43-001E, 400-44-003E, 400-43-001J & 400-43-001K

A portion of the land holdings, consists of an RV Park that houses 250 families in the peak summer season. A large percentage of these families have invested a lot of money in summer residences in our RV Park. They will definitely have an opinion about the shooting range location; however, were not made aware of any of the recent open houses.

I am extremely concerned about the proposed location and am baffled that I, nor the residents in my RV Park, did not receive any notice regarding the proposed location or the recent public meeting at Pinewood Country Club.

First, I need you to research why I was not notified. Then we need to discuss in detail the proposed location. Since we are apparently very late in the process, time is of the essence.

I have lived in the Doney Park area for nearly four years and have shot in most of the legal shooting areas around Flagstaff during that time. I think we will all agree of the need for an established shooting range in North Central Arizona. I do not believe, however that the Munds Park site is the best choice for that range. We have all gone through the disappointments of the Belmont project, and I see this as another similar failure. There are a lot of reasons why this probably isn't a good choice, but to name just a few, the topography would have to be altered significantly, numerous trees would have to be removed, prime habitat for numerous species would be disturbed. The challenges from Munds Park residents as well as Oak Creek residents have already started and will end as Belmont did. It would seem a better use of resources to start with a more practical site that has a real chance of success.

I have visited the proposed sites and the one east of Winona seems to stand the best chance of success. It is currently used by numerous shooters and has been a shooting range in the past. It is remote, and once in operation would bring fewer challenges from local residents regarding noise, traffic and other real changes associated with an operation of this type.

Please, lets all step back and take a real close look at the next step. It could be a real savings in both time and tax money. Mark Meyer, My name is Gordon Pugmire. I live in Kenai, Alaska. I see that you are going to build a new shooting range in northern Arizona. I get the NRA e-mail news and that info just showed up today. About 8 years ago, I lived in Sedona and worked in Flagstaff. Currently, I'm enjoying life in Alaska but plan to return to Sedona when the time seems rite in my old age. Although it's going to be a while before I return there, I want to help you in getting your new range. If you would be so kind to e-mail me your address, I will send a contribution. Living in Alaska has really opened my eyes to the constant up-hill struggles that take place in the lower 48. Probably the fact that almost all the government representatives here are sportsmen, hunters and fishermen is a big help in the lifestyle we have here. Guns are a big part of everyday living here. When people talk about the 911 calls for help in the states, it almost means nothing at all here, since most people don't waste the time and take care of themselves. When the Governor opened arial wolf hunting last year, there was literally thousands of e-mails and phone calls from the states giving us hell for keeping the wolf population in check. Believe it or not, most people think the wolf only kills for food. That's nothing but storybook nonsense. A few years ago, there were 2 wolves in the Kotsebue area that killed over 300 Caribou in less than a month. A wolf can run alongside a Caribou, especially on snow, and reach out with his fanges or claws and rip the stomach open on the Caribou. The Caribou runs until his guts fall out and lays down, then the wolf comes over and eats the tongue out of the Caribou while it's still alive. Then the wolf goes after another Caribou. A local Native killed the wolves and life went back to normal. It's true that you take a risk when you go hunting in Alaska because of the tremendous amount of bears that seem to be everywhere. Some people can deal with it and some can't. It's like a bull rider that knows someday he's going to get hurt. It's just a question of when. Likewise, it's a question of when you will have an encounter with a bear and the outcome is up to you. The best advise is stay prepared and don't run. From my own experiences, you can't even imagine how big a brown bear is until you come face to face with only a few feet between you. That's when there is no such thing as being over-gunned. The average rifle in Alaska is the ,338 caliber. However, most of us that have come within arms length of a brown bear prefer a lever action for speed and a larger caliber for knock-down power. I shoot a 45/70 or a 50 Alaska with 500 grain solids from Barnes Bullets or Gizzly Cartridge. If that won't do the job, you better give you soul to God because your ass is in his hands. Comments = My concern about the preferred Willard site is that it is an area with extensive wildlife, including large elk herds, White Tailed deer, and bears.

On the assessment/evaluation report for Willard it is noted that there are no known wildlife issues or concerns, and I find it hard to understand that AZ Dept of Game and Fish are not aware of them in this area. In fact, at the April 15th open house it was acknowledged to me that bears do live nearby and that they could be sensitive to this development.

The threat seems especially severe since the location is sandwiched between I17 and the rim of Oak Creek, allowing little or no room for these animals to migrate elsewhere if they are driven away by noise and increased human traffic. Big game issues are cited as reasons not to locate the facility on Anderson Mesa; why is this not a criteria for Willard?

A couple of other questions:

1. Couldn't the disadvantage of extensive logging sited for the Kendrick site be turned around to advantage if the logs were sold for timber, or even pulp?
2. Could the lack of power at some of the others site be solved by using solar and wind power?
3. Finally, Who has researched the wildlife issues thus far, who will research them in the next phase, and when will a report be available?

Thank you for consideration of my comments. I hope that you can also answer my questions.

Gentlemen,

Thank you for sponsoring the recent open house regarding the Northern Arizona Regional Shooting Facility (NAZRFS) at the du Bois Center on the NAU campus. We appreciate the opportunity to review the development information and to discuss the facility and the siting process with some of the individuals involved. We especially appreciate the opportunity to comment.

While we recognize the strong desire and benefits of a facility such as the Northern Arizona Regional Shooting Facility, we are opposed to the current plan at the Willard Springs site because it is too close to our residence at 455 W North Lodge in Munds Park. We have concerns about the noise generated from such a facility and the additional traffic and related activities that might be put on the local forest land surrounding the site.

The Willard Springs transfer station is 2.5 miles northwest as the crow flies from our residence. This looks to be the approximate center of the facility. The map shows the overall boundaries of the facility extended perhaps $\frac{1}{2}$ - $\frac{3}{4}$ miles closer to us. The area encompassed by the overall boundaries covers the forest area we often use when we go for a hike, a bike ride or simply a picnic outing in the woods. The escarpment roughly paralleling I-17 ends on the south with a point that is visible from much of Munds Park. This point is locally known as Munds Lookout, and was apparently a lookout spot for early forest service fire lookouts. It is a common summer hike and picnic destination for Munds Park residents. This point looks to be within the NAZRFS boundaries shown on one of the maps at the open house; this at least creates the impression that residents might no longer be able to get to it when the facility is operating, especially if a perimeter fence is constructed.

With regard to the noise issue, we hope that an extensive study might be done that would include the effects of multiple shooters, the loudest (i.e. largest caliber) equipment used, and various ambient conditions that would take such things as relative humidity and wind direction into account (i.e. sound travels further under some conditions than others). The bottom line is that we do not want to be able to hear the activities from our residence.

A facility such as the NAZRFS will be a destination for many, and we would expect it to attract a lot of people during specific events. Planning to make sure that facilities are in place for these types of events is going to be very important to us, so that the forest doesn't become overwhelmed by campers and people setting up their own target ranges.

We very much appreciate the opportunity to comment on the facility and look forward to learning more about the final process. Please contact us if we can be of assistance.
