

## Why a regional shooting facility?

Arizona has a rich history in a wide variety of shooting sports, with over 50 public and private shooting facilities throughout the state. There are numerous shooting enthusiast groups that promote safe participation in shooting sports, volunteer many hours to education, maintain shooting facilities, and host shooting events throughout the state. The Flagstaff area is the largest community in Arizona without a shooting facility. Many shooting enthusiasts use local cinder pits and other informal sites in the forest for recreational shooting.


The law enforcement community also lacks facilities for specialized training; this forces officers to travel to Phoenix for training or use existing shooting areas that provide substandard training opportunities. The Arizona Game and Fish Commission, through the Arizona Game and Fish Department (AGFD) wants to provide a modern facility to meet the needs of the shooting sport and law enforcement community in a safe, convenient, and managed setting.





## Planning Process

The planning process being followed for the Northern Arizona Regional Shooting Facility incorporates extensive input from potential users and the general public. As the primary land management agency in the planning area, the Forest Service is a partner in the planning process — providing guidance and input in the selection of appropriate locations.



## Program

As a regional facility, the project is planned to be more than a shooting range. It is expected to provide a location and facilities for participating in a wide variety of shooting sports.



## Finding the Right Location

One of the first steps in determining the best areas to consider for locating the regional shooting facility is to identify the areas where the facility cannot or should not be located. The first level of criteria applied to the planning area excludes areas that are not suitable due to the types of land ownership, land use, terrain, or sensitive environmental issues. **The Level I Exclusionary Criteria are:**

- State/County Parks
- Private Land (unless offered by willing owner)
- State Trust Land
- Centennial Forest
- Camp Navajo
- National Monuments
- Navajo and Hopi Land
- Wilderness Areas
- Designated Critical Habitat
- Old Growth Management Areas
- Inventoried Traditional Cultural Properties (peaks only)
- Inventoried Roadless Areas
- Inventoried Special Management Areas
- Inventoried Water Bodies
- Steep Grades
- Areas Above 8,000 Feet in Elevation
