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MAP AND DIRECTIONS TO BUCK SPRINGS

For you GPS and Google map users, the camp coordinates are 34.483167, -111.186367

I-17 / Camp Verde: it is approximately 67 miles and 1 hour 47 minutes

From I-17 at Camp Verde, take the **SR260** General Crook Trail **east** to SR 87, turn left and go **North on SR87** past FR 3 Lake Mary Road to just past the Blue Ridge Ranger Station. **Turn right on FR95** and follow it south. Go to the intersection of FR 95 and FR 139 turn **left on FR139**. Go to the intersection of FR 139 and FR139G. Turn **right on FR139G** and the camp is 100 yards north on the right.

From Payson: it is approximately 60 miles and 1 hour 45 minutes.

Travel north on **SR 87**, past Pine, past Strawberry, past HWY 260, and past FR 3 Lake Mary Road to just past the Blue Ridge Ranger Station. **Turn right on FR95** and follow it south. Go to the intersection of FR 95 and FR 139 turn **left on FR139**. Go to the intersection of FR 139 and FR139G. Turn **right on FR139G** and the camp is 100 yards north on the right.

From I-40 / Winslow: it is approximately 54 miles and 1 hour 33 minutes

From I-40 at Winslow, take **SR87 South** approximately 42 miles (just past FR316) to **FR95** and **turn left on FR95**. Follow FR95 south. Go to the intersection of FR 95 and FR 139 turn **left on FR139**. Go to the intersection of FR 139 and FR139G. Turn **right on FR139G** and the camp is 100 yards north on the right.





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From State Route 87 turn south onto NF 95 just east of the Blue Ridge Ranger Station. Travel approximately 8.5 miles to NF 139. Turn left onto 139. Travel approximately 3.8 miles and turn right on 139G. Camp site is 200 yards from intersection.
