A public meeting of the Arizona Game and Fish Commission will be held on Thursday July 19, 2007 at 9:00 a.m. as authorized by A.R.S. § 17-201(D). Members of the Commission will attend either in person or by telephone conference call. The Commission will discuss and may vote to take action on the following matters:

Thursday, July 19, 2007, Arizona Game and Fish Commission at the Arizona Game and Fish Department Headquarters, 2221 W. Greenway Rd., Phoenix, AZ 85023.

Meeting begins at 9:00 a.m.

1. Presenter: Tony Guiles, Legislative Liaison. State and Federal Legislation. The Commission will be briefed on the status of State and Federal legislation, including House Resolution 2262 The Hardrock Mining and Reclamation Act of 2007. The Commission may vote to take a position or provide direction to the Department for coordination, action, or proposed changes to legislation or other elective issues related to Department responsibilities.

2. Executive Session.

a. Litigation and Legal Counsel. The Commission may vote to meet in executive session pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.03(A)(4) for discussions and consultations with the Commission's attorney and for the Commission to consider its position on this item.

3. Call to the Public. Those persons wishing to speak should complete a speaker's card and present it to the host. Unless prior approval has been granted by the Chairman, comments will be limited to no more than three minutes. No discussion or action will be taken by the Commission. Any items requiring further discussion or action will be included on a future Commission meeting agenda.



The Arizona Game and Fish Department is responsible for managing Arizona's fish and wildlife resource as an enduring public trust. In addition, the Department is charged with promoting safe and responsible use of watercraft and off-highway vehicles. Funding is provided from the sale of licenses and permits; watercraft registration fees; federal excise taxes on firearms, fishing equipment, boats, and other sporting goods; State lottery revenues; donations on State income tax forms; and various contracts and grants. Department policy is set by the Arizona Game and Fish Commission, whose five members are appointed by the Governor.
