**SPECIAL NOTICE OF AN
EMERGENCY MEETING OF THE
ARIZONA GAME AND FISH COMMISSION
HELD JUNE 9, 2004 AT 8:30 A.M.**

Pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.02 (D), notice is hereby given that an emergency meeting of the Arizona Game and Fish Commission was held on June 9, 2004, at 8:30 a.m. by telephone conference call from the offices of the Arizona Game and Fish Department, 2222 W. Greenway Road, Phoenix, Arizona.

At the emergency meeting the Arizona Game and Fish Commission discussed and decided the following matter:

- 1. Presenter: Duane Shroufe, Director. Consideration of an Extension of the Internet Hunt Permit Application Deadline.** The Department's Internet application provider's computer server failed on June 8, 2004, and this failure may have delayed or prevented some hunt permit applications from being completed over the Internet prior to the 7 p.m., June 8, 2004, deadline. As a consequence of this server failure, the Director, under existing authority from the Commission, extended the online deadline to 7 p.m., June 9, 2004. To address the potential that the Internet application provider's computer problems will persist, or recur, the Department held an emergency telephonic Commission meeting and asked the Commission to vote to authorize the Director to extend the Internet only hunt permit application deadline to allow for the potential of further problems. The Commission voted to authorize the Director to extend the application deadline in 24-hour increments through June 14, 2004, if necessary to ensure that the public has ample opportunity to apply for the draw in the event that the computer problems persist or recur.

Under this authority, the Director has extended the application deadline for an additional 24-hour period, through 7 p.m. (MST) on June 10, 2004, to allow the public additional time to apply for the draw.
