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Introduction

It is important to periodically evaluate our ability to communicate our position on issues with the state legislature. The legislative voting record on these issues is one way to measure our effectiveness in communicating our position. The following is a list of legislative voting records from the 47th first regular session (2005) for issues on which the Game and Fish Commission has taken a formal position. A brief summary of the bills is also included.

Key to the Tables on the Following Pages

S = Legislator signed on as a sponsor of the particular legislation

+ = Voted with the formal position taken by the Commission

- = Voted against the formal position taken by the Commission

***** = No vote was taken in Committee or on the floor, or the member was absent when the vote was taken.

Impact

Because not all bills impact the Department to an equal degree, the bills are assigned a level of impact in order to place a greater emphasis on more important bills in which the Department sought more support. The votes on all bills are weighted in accordance with the degree of impact on the Department. In general, the level of impact of a bill is measured by considering the bill's affect on the existing authority of the Commission, the Department's financial security, or the Department's overall ability to effectively manage wildlife.

The weighting scale is as follows:

Bill of <u>NORMAL</u> Impact:	Vote in favor of AZGFD position +1	Against AZGFD position -1
Bill of <u>MEDIUM</u> Impact:	Vote in favor of AZGFD position +3	Against AZGFD position -3
Bill of <u>HIGH</u> Impact:	Vote in favor of AZGFD position +6	Against AZGFD position -6

Bill Sponsorship

A bill sponsor of a bill supported by the Commission will receive 2 additional points per bill sponsorship

A bill sponsor of a bill opposed by the Commission will lose 2 points per bill sponsorship

Total Points = Total number of weighted points versus the total number of weighted points possible (excluding points possible from bill sponsorship) if the legislator were to consistently vote in favor of the AZGFD position.

% of Points Agreed = Agreement between legislators voting record and Commission positions on legislation. This number is derived by dividing the weighted points earned by the legislator by the amount of weighted points possible out of the votes in which the legislator participated.

Agreement/Actions = Number of times legislators voted in agreement with the Commission's position versus the number of times legislators actually voted on Department policy.

% Agreement = Agreement between legislators voting record and Commission positions on the issues. This number is derived by dividing the number of a legislator's actions (votes and/or sponsorship) that agrees with the Commission position by the total number of actions taken by the legislator on these issues.

Note

This scorecard is not intended to be used in judging legislators, but rather, our ability to effectively communicate our position on issues. Also, these calculations do not take into account work that goes on behind the scene on legislative issues (i.e., helping a bill be heard and debated).

H2127 Big game permits; compassionate transfer (Chapter 10, Laws 2005)

(Representative Biggs) Allows a person to transfer his or her big game permit to a qualified organization for use by a minor child who has a life threatening medical condition. Allows the Commission to determine the manner and conditions of the transfer and use of the permit or tag. **Signed by Governor Napolitano 4/1/05**

Impact Level: NORMAL (Yes vote +1, No vote -1)

H2643 Lower Colorado River multispecies; conservation (Chapter 78, Laws 2005)

(Representative O'Halleran) Allows the Game and Fish Commission to assess additional watercraft registration fees to be collected solely for the purpose of funding the Multispecies Conservation Project (MSCP). The Commission may also impose and collect surcharges on special use permits used on the Colorado River. The amount is to be determined by the Commission and the surcharges may only be used for the MSCP. The Multi-County Water Conservation Board shall manage the funds collected for the MSCP or designate a private financial institution or the State Treasurer as a fiscal agent. The MSCP is the cooperative effort to provide the basis for compliance with the Endangered Species Act of 1973. **Signed by Governor Napolitano 4/13/05**

S1271: Schools; Arizona gun safety program (Chapter 58, Laws 2005)

(Senator Johnson) Requires the Arizona Game and Fish Commission, the Department of Public Safety and private firearms organizations to develop a one-semester course in firearms marksmanship to be called the "Arizona Gun Safety Program Course" for school districts and charter schools to offer as an elective course. The course must include instruction on gun safety and basic operation, history of firearms, marksmanship, the role of firearms in preserving peace and freedom, the constitutional roots of the right to keep and bear arms, instruction on use of clay targets, practice time at a range, and demonstration of firearms competence. Instructors must be certified by the Game and Fish Department. **Signed by Governor Napolitano 4/11/05**

Impact Level: NORMAL (Yes vote +1, No vote -1)

S1365: Game and Fish; Fees (Chapter 318, Laws 2005)

(Senator Cannell) Increases the statutory maximum fee the Commission may set for hunting and fishing licenses and permits and establishes new types of licenses, including a family hunting license and super conservation licenses for hunting, fishing and a combination. Increases the number of big game tags a person may hold, from two to three. Also, increases watercraft registration fees which will become effective beginning September 1, 2005. Prohibits the sale of bighorn sheep parts, except those confiscated by or donated to the Department. Because this bill increases net state revenues, two-thirds majority is required for passage. **Signed by Governor Napolitano 5/20/05**

S1513: Budget; general appropriations (Chapter 286, Laws 2005)

(Senator Burns) General appropriations bill for the operation for state government in fiscal 2005-06. General fund spending increased by 11.5% over fiscal 2004-05 and stands at 8.2 billion. The bill appropriates to the Game and Fish Department \$25,855,400 in FY06 and \$25,777,500 in FY07. The appropriation provides for the replacement of field enforcement vehicles and aircraft engines, and \$101,500 to restore operating funding, among the normal appropriations. A total of \$1,596,000 is appropriated from the Watercraft Licensing Fund to meet the state's obligation in the Zuni Tribe water rights settlement. **Signed by Governor Napolitano 5/20/05**

Impact Level: HIGH (Yes vote +6, No vote -6)

S1514: Budget; capitol outlay (Chapter 298, Laws 2005)

(Senator Burns) General appropriations bill for capital projects for fiscal 2005-06. Appropriates a total of \$1,018,900 to the Game and Fish Department for capitol improvements. **Signed by Governor Napolitano 5/20/05**

H2169 land use planning; water resources

(Representative O'Halleran) The water resources component of a comprehensive general plan (as prescribed by the Growing Smarter legislation) developed by a municipality or county is expanded to include reports on water conservation efforts, drought management efforts, and the practicality of regional coordination. The bill also requires local governments that are in the same groundwater basin or subbasin to share information in order to work toward regional water plan integration. **Died in House Natural Resources and Agriculture Committee 2/7/05**

Impact Level: NORMAL (Yes vote +1, No vote -1)

H2440 state lottery; distributions

(Representative McComish) Simplifies the distribution of funds from lottery proceeds to state programs by having the total collected revenues (excluding prizes and operating expenses) go into the Lottery Fund to be disbursed to beneficiaries. The Game and Fish Commission Heritage Fund remains as the third beneficiary on the distribution list. The maximum amount the Game and Fish Heritage Fund may receive annually is \$10 million. **Held in House Appropriations (Pearce) Committee 3/2/05**

Impact Level: NORMAL (Yes vote +1, No vote -1)

H2554 state lake improvement fund

(Representative Groe) Limits the use of State Lake Improvement Fund (SLIF) money to projects on waters where *only* gas-powered boats are permitted. SLIF monies are used to fund public projects on waters where boats are permitted. These projects include public launching ramps, piers, picnic tables, parking areas, and campgrounds. **Held in House Natural Resources and Agriculture Committee 2/14/05**

Impact Level: MEDIUM (Yes vote -3, No vote +3)

H2613 forest healthy amendments

(Representative Chase) HB 2613 changes the requirements for a business to qualify for tax incentives relating to healthy forest enterprises, reduces the tax on fuel used in vehicles transporting forest products and provides a property tax reduction for real and personal property and improvements for qualified forest product harvesting and processing. HB 2613 also requires the State Forester to maintain a web site and instructs the Arizona Department of Commerce to implement a program that encourages local governments to provide incentives for businesses that promote forest health. **Vetoed by Governor Napolitano 4/15/05**

S1067 appropriation; Zuni tribe water settlement

(Senator Flake) Appropriates \$800,000 in FY05-06 and \$796,000 in FY06-07 from the Arizona Game and Fish Heritage Fund for the Zuni Indian Tribe water rights settlement. According to terms of the settlement, the money will be used for wetland restoration projects. **Vetoed by Governor Napolitano 5/2/05**

Impact Level: HIGH (Yes vote -6, No vote +6)

S1349 unlawful feeding of wildlife

(Senator Hellon) Prohibits the feeding of wildlife, excluding birds and squirrels. A violation of this prohibition is classified as a class 3 misdemeanor (lowest), punishable by imprisonment for up to 30 days, a fine up to \$500 and up to one year of probation. **Died in Senate Natural Resources and Rural Affairs Committee 2/16/05**

Impact Level: MEDIUM (Yes vote +3, No vote -3)

S1459 river reservoir repair appropriation

(Senator Flake) A one-time appropriation of \$750,000 from the Department of Water Resources to repair the River Reservoir on the Little Colorado River in Apache County. **Held in House Rules Committee 4/7/05**

Chart 1. Percentage of Representatives Unweighted Votes in Agreement with AZGFD Position




Chart 1 Cont. Percentage of Representatives Unweighted Votes in Agreement with AZGFD Position




Chart 2. Percentage of Representatives' Weighted Votes in Agreement with AZGFD Position




Chart 2 Cont. Percentage of Representatives' Weighted Votes in Agreement with the AZGFD Position





Chart 3. House Votes in Agreement with AZGFD Position on Department-Related Bills

Chart 4. Percentage of Senators' Unweighted Votes in Agreement with AZGFD Position




Chart 5. Percentage of Senators' Weighted Votes in Agreement with AZGFD Position




Chart 6. Senate Votes in Agreement with AZGFD Position on Department-Related Bills
