<p><b>H2631 TRUST LAND REFORM; TEACHER CAREER LADDER</b>  <b>S/E</b></p> <p>When the state land dept notifies a municipality or county that it intends to amend a conceptual plan for state trust land, the planning department of the municipality or county must cooperate in amending the plan. A mediation procedure is established if the state and the planning agency cannot agree on how to integrate the changes in trust land with the general plan. The land dept must be notified by a municipality or county that has state trust land within its borders if it is considering changes to its general plan that may affect trust land. If a municipality or county contains a high noise or accident potential zone associated with a military airport and has state trust land within its borders, it must include the land dept in its consultations on amendments to its general plan. Additionally, the career ladder program for teachers in the state closes to new participants on June 30, 2005. Monies from the sale and lease of state trust land that are earmarked for public schools are designated for additional compensation bonuses for classroom teachers. The makeup of the department's special inventory of trust land in Pima and Maircopa Counties that is available to be considered for sale or lease is changed to include only trust land within one mile of a city of fewer than 10,000 people or within 3 miles of a city of 10,000 or more. References to trust land being classified as suitable for conservation are deleted. Provisions are added to allow exchange of trust land for conservation purposes. More. 48 pp. First sponsor: Rep. Its list of statutory employees grows by adding a deputy director, a state fire training officer and a fire resources coordinator. Fees are authorized to be collection for the fire inspection revolving fund and the fire training revolving fund. Statutes pertaining to the state forester are moved from title 37 (public lands) to title 41 (state government) -- impossible to determine whether there are any changes in duties and powers without a line-by-line comparison.
