Welcome to Arizona's largest hands-on outdoor exposition, where you can actually experience a wide range of interesting products and outdoor activities. You can shoot the latest firearms from top firearms manufacturers, try your hand at archery, or attend informative workshops. From live wildlife and ATVs to the catch-and-release fish tank and cowboy action shooting – it's all here.

How should I plan my day?

There are loads of fun and interesting things to do. Just like at a major amusement park, your biggest challenge is going to be doing it all in one day. The activities are grouped into four areas. You can use the free trolleys or the walking trails to visit each of them. To help you get started, we are providing a map (and activity schedule) on the inside pages. Keep it handy. It is like a treasure map of fun things to do and see at the Expo. Here are just a few of the activities you can choose from:

AREA 1 – Firearm Manufacturers, Specialty Shooting, Exhibitors Tent #1 and Food Court

Try out the latest firearms in a safe, supervised environment on the Benchrest Range. Manufacturers on hand will include Sturm, Ruger & Co.; GLOCK; Smith & Wesson; and Marlin.

Interested in learning different specialty shooting disciplines? Try your hand at cowboy action shooting, black powder, tactical pistol, rifle and pistol silhouette, and more, hosted by local shooting organizations. Kids will have the opportunity to shoot .22s and air guns and learn more about firearm safety. There is a nominal charge for ammunition at some of the shooting venues.

Visit with commercial vendors and outdoor organizations in the Exhibitors Tent. Food and beverages are available for purchase at the Food Court.

AREA 2 – Off-Highway Vehicles, Horse-Mounted Shooting and Hunting Dog Demonstrations

Learn everything you've wanted to know about off-highway vehicle (OHV) recreation! View quads, dirt bikes, rock crawlers, 4x4s and other OHVs. See exciting rock crawler demonstrations. Check out the 2WD vs. 4WD demonstrator and the adventure simulator. Learn where to ride and what clubs you can join. Learn how to ride responsibly to protect wildlife habitat.

In this area, you can also see exciting mounted action shooting demonstrations from the Arizona Cowboy Mounted Shooters Association and displays by the 10th Cavalry Buffalo Soldiers.

You can also attend educational demonstrations of hunting dogs working in collaboration with their owners.



AREA 3 – Family Fun Adventures, Archery, Outdoor Workshops, Exhibitors Tent #2 and Boating Safety Education

Hop on a trolley to this must-see area. Bring your family to the huge catch-and-release fishing tank, do activities at the hunter education field course/nature trail, try out the kids climbing wall, and view live wildlife from the Adobe Mountain Wildlife Center and the Phoenix Herpetological Society.

Learn archery techniques (all abilities welcome) or try out 3D archery on a walking course through the desert. See the state's top archers compete at the Arizona Outdoor Archery State Championships.

Head over to the "outdoor workshops" area for our series of entertaining, interactive workshops. See live animals, learn about Arizona's raptors and rattlesnakes, get tips on quail hunting or

learn how to take advantage of Arizona's best fishing in 25 years. A complete schedule is located on the inside pages. Visit outdoor organizations, government agencies and vendors in the Exhibitors Tent and nearby grounds. You can also visit booths to learn about boating recreation and safety.

AREA 4 – Clay Target Center

Make the short trolley trip out to the completely refurbished Clay Target Center and learn how to shoot skeet and sporting clays in a safe, supervised environment. Try out shotguns from Benelli (nominal charge for ammunition). View incredible shooting demonstrations from world-renowned shooter Tim Bradley. Visit with vendors and other exhibitors.

On Saturday, you can watch the Scholastic Clay Target Program's Commissioner's Cup Sporting Clays State Championships. More than 200 youths will compete for state titles.


