Planning your day at the Outdoor Expo

The activities are spread out among seven different areas, all easily accessible by our trolley system. We recommend you explore each area. Here are just a few of the activities you can choose from:

Area 1 – Off-Highway Vehicles.

Learn everything you want to know about off-highway vehicle recreation! Test-drive ATVs on the new ATV course. See rock crawler demonstrations. View quads, rock crawlers, sand rails, 4x4s and dirt bikes on display.

Area 2 – Family Outdoor Adventures.

Whether you're young or just young at heart, you can catch fish from our catch-and-release fishing area, test your skill at air gun or .22 rifle shooting, do activities on the hunter field course/nature trail, and view live wildlife. Have your youth audition to be "guest host for a day" for a future episode of the *Arizona Wildlife Views* television show. Visit with a wide range of exhibitors in the area's Exhibitors' Tent. Attend workshops on hunting and wildlife conservation (see schedule on inside pages). Don't forget to try out Olympic-style air rifle and air pistol shooting in the Air Gun Building.

Area 3 – Firearm Manufacturers Area.

Try out the latest firearms in a safe, supervised environment on the shooting range. Manufacturers on hand will include Smith & Wesson; Sturm, Ruger & Co.; and Glock.

Area 4 – Vendor Showcase, Food Court and Activity Center.

Visit with a wide range of exhibitors in the Exhibitors' Tent. Attend workshops in the Activity Center on wildlife, hunting and boating (see schedule on inside pages). Visit the food court. Check out the climbing wall, hang gliding exhibits, canoe/kayak information, and Dutch oven cooking demonstrations.



Area 5 – Specialty Shooting Ranges.

Try out specialty shooting disciplines (cowboy action, black powder, rifle and pistol silhouette shooting, and more) on specialty ranges, sponsored by local shooting organizations. You can also try out a Gatling gun and learn about high-power rifle shooting. Representatives of the different organizations will teach you about their shooting disciplines.

Area 6 – Clay Target Center.

On Saturday, you can watch the Scholastic Clay Target Program's Commissioners' Cup State Sporting Clays Championships. More than 200 youths will be competing

for the state title. On Sunday, you can learn how to shoot trap, skeet and sporting clays, or international trap and skeet, all day. View clay target shooting demonstrations by world-class shooter Emily Blount on both days.

Area 7 – Archery.

Test your skill on an archery course and learn archery techniques—for all ages and skill levels! On Saturday, you can also watch the Arizona Archery in the Schools State Championships. On Sunday, you can watch the Arizona State University collegiate archery competition.
