1. Amount of monies spent or encumbered in the fund during the preceding fiscal year (State FY11) for the purposes of off highway vehicle law enforcement activities. **\$1,304,865**
2. The amount of monies spent from the off highway vehicle recreation fund during the preceding fiscal year (State FY11) for employee services. **\$1,568,775**

**The Arizona Game and Fish Department does not currently record verbal or written warnings in its Spillman© database system. However, we are currently building a database that will capture written warnings and anticipate reporting this data for State FY12. Citations are issued statewide and the location data is searchable by the six Department regions around the State, as well as the Phoenix headquarters. The attached map shows the locations of the Arizona Game and Fish Department regional offices, regional boundaries and the counties throughout the State. Listed below is the number of OHV related State FY11 citations written between July 01, 2010 and June 30, 2011 in each region and by officers at the Phoenix headquarters.**

**Region 1 – 120 citations  
Region 2 – 156 citations  
Region 3 – 53 citations  
Region 4 – 43 citations  
Region 5 – 81 citations  
Region 6 – 145 citations  
Phoenix Headquarters – 40 citations  
Total Citations = 638**

6.
