**NEED STATEMENT/PROBLEM ANALYSIS:**

The plant community in the area is primarily pinon/juniper woodland. Through the years junipers have invaded the area and are currently on need of removal to reestablish grassland areas that historically occurred in the area. Removal of junipers would be accomplished through the use of an dozer operated mostly by the rancher. After removal and drying, the treated juniper slash would need to be opened to wood cutters and/or burned to enhance the production of grasses and forbs. The area is popular among elk, turkey and deer hunters.

**PROJECT OBJECTIVES:**

The primary objective of this project is to enhance grassland habitat through the use of a dozer to remove junipers. Habitat enhancement would occur through the removal of junipers and subsequent burning to expand the grassland/woodland edge effect.

**PROJECT STRATEGIES:**

Use a dozer to remove junipers on approximately 600 acres of historic grassland.

The land is managed by the United States Forest Service, Tonto National Forest, and Pleasant Valley Ranger District.

**HABITAT DESCRIPTION:**

The plant community in the area is primarily grassland and pinon/juniper woodland at an average elevation of 5000 feet above sea level. Species include various grasses, alligator, pinion pine, and oak brush. The diversity of plant species would increase after treatment with more grasses, shrubs and forbs.






