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<p>Brief Project Summary: I propose to pipe water from Bobtail Spring located south of the Pinal Mountains on Tonto National Forest property to a storage tank that would feed two drinkers (1 for livestock and 1 for wildlife). The spring would be fenced. This siphoning process would be accomplished by using a generator powered by solar panels.</p> <p>The project area is primarily chaparral habitat with little year round water. There is currently an old pipeline that runs from an unknown water source in the spring, which would provide the water needed to the holding tank and drinkers.</p> <p>The permittee from the Lyons Fork Allotment (Government Springs Ranch) has volunteered to provide heavy equipment and labor. The primary project accomplishment will be to provide reliable year round water into important wildlife habitat in the southern portion of game management unit 24A near the Pinal Mountains as well as to cattle in the area. This area will be monitored after the project is completed to determine the extent of wildlife use.</p>

NEED STATEMENT – PROBLEM ANALYSIS:

The project area is quality wildlife habitat; however, the vicinity has very little water. With the addition of these drinkers and holding tank, water would be available to all wildlife as well as livestock year round. These drinkers would also allow the larger animals to avoid trampling vegetation in the spring during times of dry hot climates.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

- The objective of this project is to provide cattle and wildlife an alternative source of water.
- Keep cattle away from impacting the spring
- Fence off solar panels and spring.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND STRATEGIES:

The primary project accomplishment will be to allow cattle to utilize a water source nearby away from the occurring riparian area and to provide reliable year round water into important white tail habitat in the southern portion of AGFD management unit 24A near the Pinal Mountains. This area will be monitored after the project is completed to determine the extent of deer use. The area will be surveyed during post season surveys, and examined at other times of the year to quantify deer use of the area, and to insure that water is available.



Township-T2S Range-R15E Section S17



The location of drinkers and holding tank is composed of primarily manzanita and scrub oak. The location of the holding tank and drinkers will require some clearing, but will be handled by the permittee.
