
NEED STATEMENT – PROBLEM ANALYSIS: The need of water sources in 23S is part of the overall long-term habitat needs that will improve deer habitat and sustain a viable to growing population. GMU 23 South used to sustain a much larger deer population. Part of the problem with the depressed population that currently exists is water availability. The deer in the Bull Mountain area will benefit from this water source and hopefully increase fawn survival as it is located away from high pressure areas.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES: This project will clean out and seal a dirt tank to provide water for wildlife.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND STRATEGIES: This project will clean out and seal a dirt tank. The tank is silted in and only holds water for short periods. The tank historically has not held water and will benefit from bentonite application. The tank will be cleaned of excess silt via dozer or trackhoe and bentonite will be applied and covered by soil. The tank is approximately 21,500 sq ft. It has been determined that the tank will need bentonite applied at 2lbs per sq foot for a total of 43,00lbs of bentonite needed.

This project is NEPA ready. The EAC is to be completed. Archeological Clearances and Categorical Exclusions have been completed by the Forest Service.

Attached are the two projects that have been authorized for the Walnut Allotment. As for the dirt stock tanks generally these are covered under maintenance of existing improvements and don't need specific written clearances so long as they stay within the original footprint of the existing tank, there is a well-established road to the tank and they notify us prior to bringing equipment onto the Forest. So for the Big Bull Mountain Tank since it is right off the side of the 60 Chas has talked with us about this and has verbal authorization to clean and bentonite this tank.
